KEYNOTE



Described by the New York Times as a conductor who "radiates enthusiasm" and the Los Angeles Times as "a real grabber," Jung-Ho Pak is known for his unique vision of the role of classical music; he believes that music's positive impact on humanity can change the world. Since 2007, he has worked to implement that vision as Artistic Director and Conductor of

the Cape Symphony.

A nationally recognized educator, Jung-Ho served as Music Director with the University of Southern California (USC) Symphony and the San Francisco Conservatory of Music Orchestra. He has also served as Principal Conductor of the Emmy-nominated Disney Young Musicians Symphony Orchestra. From 2003-2013, he was Director of Orchestras and Music Director of the World Youth Symphony Orchestra and at the Interlochen Center for the Arts. His commitment to music education is unflagging.

Jung-Ho has conducted with major symphonies and at conservatories around the world, and brings all of that experience to the Cape Symphony. He's also a frequent speaker on television and radio, including TED Talks and NPR appearances, as well as a clinician and conductor at national music festivals. Jung-Ho believes that artists have a responsibility to do their best work – and he lives by that creed.

Jason Weeks is the Executive Director of the Cambridge Arts Council, a city department and public non-profit agency in Cambridge, MA. Cambridge Arts engages residents and visitors with programming designed to stimulate awareness, participation and support for the arts. Jason works



with an Advisory Board, Trustees of the non-profit corporation, the Cambridge Public Art Commission, elected officials, city administration and agency staff to oversee an awardwinning Public Art/Percent-for-Art program, the Cambridge Arts

Grant Program, Creative Marketplace, the Cambridge Street Performer Program and annual events including Cambridge Arts River Festival, Summer in the City, Cambridge Open Studios, and other community based initiatives.

In addition to his role at Cambridge Arts, Jason is an adjunct professor at Boston University for Arts Administration and regularly delivers academic lectures and participates in conferences and symposia to discuss effective arts administration strategies and community-based partnership and programming.
