Programming paid for through Access:

Tap; drama workshops of all levels; Lion King vacation camp; summer art camps; creative movement; jazz; improv; Broadway kids; modern dance; culinary arts; school vacation art week camps; teen acting class; violin lessons; and comedy workshops.

Field trips taken included trips to the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston, Fuller Craft Museum, Barnstable Performing Arts Center, Institute of Contemporary Art, Peabody Essex, Boston Symphony Hall, Cotuit Center for the Arts, and a trip to New York City to see Broadway!

Approximately \$40K supported grants creating access to arts and culture for free for local students and families. Programs like Musical Discoveries for toddlers, art mentorships for teens, multicultural art series for parents and children, regular workshops for at-risk youth, and many more.
